

Special edition of Clinical Anatomy

A special edition of *Clinical Anatomy* will appear in September 2016. The aim of this edition is to bridge the gap between clinical anatomy and palaeopathology. The editors of this edition are Graham Louw from the University of Cape Town and Maryna Steyn from the University of the Witwatersrand (South Africa). The introduction to this volume was written by Frank Ruhli and colleagues, with a paper entitled "Palaeopatology, current challenges and medical impact". Other contributions include a paper on child abuse and how to recognize it (Ross and Juarez), an overview of recognition of nutritional deficiencies (Meyer), skeletal manifestations of tuberculosis infections in modern human remains (Steyn and Buskes) DISH (diffuse idiopathic skeletal hyperostosis) and the correlations between the disease as a clinical entity and the skeletal signs (Holgate and Steyn), congenital abnormalities of the appendicular skeleton (Oostra et al.), prevalence of cribra orbitalia in modern populations (Steyn et al.) and the correlation between histological changes of disease in dry and wet bones (De Boer).
